When compared to the whole thing, only a moment sticks out. Protrusions in mind-space that want to be gathered together as collected bodies getting damp in unison. Sometimes there is a rhyme, like moments lying in the tub, which invite your mind to invent places, places you want to vacation. Harmonious moments of singing or clapping hands or getting a deep groove on which draws you into a place. Objects are designed to be collected or consumed. Limited editions become a form of currency - with reinterpreted found objects; the uniqueness here is in the ideas of choice over technique, positioning and relevance to personal importance. Aesthetic decisions of what is 'in' and what is 'out' become part of the language for interaction and meaning. Galleries, for the most part, have created a contingency that a collector of things will come, a collector will have the answer and the collector will want a wet one. We all just want wet ones, fresh from old thoughts, wet from the studio to put in a house to kiss and sweat together.

Martin Basher (b. 1979 New Zealand) received his BA in Fine Art from Columbia University in 2003 and his MFA in 2008. Basher's recent exhibitions include Saatchi & Saatchi; Art in General, NY; Exit Art, NY, The Public Art Fund at Socrates Sculpture Park, NY, and Starkwhite, New Zealand. Martin lives and works in New York City.
